SWEET 16 RETURNEES: Buyer Beware!

With the 2011 NCAA Tournament entering the SWEET 16 round, let's take a different perspective in analyzing the teams that have arrived. It pertains specifically to teams that are returning to the SWEET 16 for the 2nd straight year. Do they perform like a team with experience and panache, or do they execute like CEO's looking for golden parachutes and cushy bonuses while steering a sinking ship? Let's take a peek.

HOW DO YOU DO – According to our database, since 1991, teams making a right-back appearance in the SWEET 16 are 56-39 SU and 42-51-2 ATS in Round Three of the tourney. The cut-line, however, is often times the points spread. That's confirmed by the fact that favorites of more than 6 points are 31-2 SU and 21-12 ATS in these games. Priced at anything less (dog or favorite of 6 or fewer points), they dip drastically to 25-37 SU and 21-39-2 ATS in competitive contests. Last year witnessed five SWEET 16 returnees, all of whom collectively managed to go 2-2-1 ATS during this round.

ALL ABOARD – Taking a look at this year's list of returnees, we find no less than four teams that were here last year. They include – **Butler, Duke, Kentucky and Ohio State.** Looking at it from a different perspective, one major exception to the rule is that SWEET 16 returnees seem to struggle when arriving off a win of less than 10 points, going just **13-27-2 ATS.**

SAYONARA – Worse, when SWEET 16 returnees arrive off a single-digit win after having won their opening round tournament game by fewer than 15 points, they drop to 7-15 SU and 4-16-2 ATS, including **2-14-2 ATS** when facing a foe off an ATS win. **EY!** The life rafts are ready and standing by for **Butler and Kentucky.** The bottom line is you can draw your own conclusions, if you like. But make no mistake... when it comes to handicapping teams in the SWEET 16, the winners will likely be the better-qualified teams that have 'been there-and-done that'. Or those who know how to keep a ship afloat, if you know what I mean...

TOURNAMENT INCREDIBLE STAT

UNC head coach Roy Williams is 25-0 SU and 16-8-1 ATS in the NCAA Tourney versus sub .700 opponents, including 6-0 ATS as a favorite of less than nine points.

With top-seeded Pitt sent packing, Gator nation can now smell the Final Four. We think you'll agree that the road to Houston may just be paved with a little swamp water when you get a whiff of this gem: Florida lost to BYU, 99-92, in double overtime in the first round of last year's Dance and the last eight NCAA tourney teams seeking NCAA TKO revenge from the previous season are a determined 6-2 SU and ATS. That stat comes courtesy of our PLAYBOOK.com database, as does this one: Florida HC Billy Donovan is an amazing **8-1 SU and ATS** versus No.1-4 seeds in this event and a Mariano Rivera-like 11-2 SU and 10-3 ATS in closing games from the Sweet 16 out. We've also wisely kept our March Madness Tournament Guide at our disposal and it points out that the Gators, by far, have the best record of all the remaining Sweet 16 squads when facing fellow tourney teams this season, posting a 14-3 SU and 12-4-1 ATS mark, including a spotless 2-0 AU and ATS during this Dance. BYU head coach Dave Rose's 7-14-1 ATS post-season log, including a winless **0-7 SU and 0-6-1 ATS** as a pick or dog, insures that tonight's revenge dish will best be served by a bunch of cold-shooting Cougars. Florida by a touchdown as the Gators' five-returning starters put the chomp on BYU's one-man 'Jimmer show'.

(4) Wisconsin over (8) Butler by 6

While Butler came through for us in our first round call against Old Dom, the Bulldogs cost us a sweep of the late phones on Saturday (3-1, +7.7 units). Not only do we get mad, we get more than even, as well! Butler's 11-7 SU and 13-4-1 ATS mark versus the Big Ten since 2000 (beat Michigan State in the Final Four last season) – along with HC Brad Stevens' 14-11 SU and 18-6-1 ATS log a dog, including 9-1-1 ATS off an ATS win – warns us to tread lightly. However, Wisky hits the Big Easy with some gaudy numbers of its own. Bo Ryan's Badgers are 22-1 SU versus Horizon League foes while Ryan, himself, is a long-term 115-72-3 ATS when having three or more days to prepare, including **18-3 ATS** as a dog or favorite of four or less points versus non-conference opposition. There's certainly good numbers on both

sides of the ball our database reminds us that teams arriving to the Sweet 16 off back-to-back SU dog wins are just 3-23 SU, including 1-5 ATS when not taking five or more points. Here's another beauty that can only be found in PLAYBOOK: along with Duke, Ohio State and Kentucky, the Bulldogs are one of four Sweet 16 returnees. Unlike those schools, though, Butler is the only one of the four off a SU dog win and these 'Sweet' returnees do not perform well in that role, posting a **3-11-1 ATS** mark in this round. Unlike last season, look for Wisconsin to put a smile on Gordon Gee's face as Big Ten pedigree finds Cinderella's glass (slipper) half empty this year. Lay it if you play it.

After entering a record 11 teams in this year's tourney, the mighty Big East is now down to a measly two. And with this conference **1-8 ATS** as favorites of less than seven points in this round, and **1-9 ATS** as a pick or favorite of four or less points from the Sweet 16 out, it may be down to none by the time the weekend rolls around. With Marquette a healthy underdog to Carolina, the Huskies are the league's best chance to save some face. Keep a close eye on the line as it may very well tell the story tonight in Anaheim. The Aztecs are on a nice little SU and ATS run and in his career, Connecticut head coach Jim Calhoun is like the little girl with the curls when facing teams off three straight wins and covers. If the veteran head coach is a dog against these teams, he sports a moneymaking 6-2 SU and 7-1 ATS mark. However, if ol' Jimmy shows up at pick or a favorite of two or less points, that number falls to a winless **0-4 SU and ATS**. San Diego State HC Steve Fisher, meanwhile, is a solid 7-1 SU from the Sweet Sixteen through the Final Four. And while his Aztecs are 0-3 SU and ATS versus the Big East under his lead, we feel the No. 9 Defensive Field Goal Percentage (39.2) squad in the land with its five returning starters will put this underachieving conference out of its misery. The site strongly favors the Aztecs – and so do we.

UPSET SPECIAL

(5) Arizona over (1) Duke by 3

Duke and Arizona last met in the 2001 National Championship game with the Blue Devils claiming the title of best team in the land with a 10-point victory. The 'Cats haven't advanced past the Elite 8 since but this year's version, led by Pac-10 Player of the Year Derrick Williams, looks like it has may have a few extra lives. Thanks to a quick (and incorrect) five-second call against Texas, Arizona escaped Tulsa with an improbable victory. With the Blue Devils 5-0 SU and ATS against the Pac-10 since 2001 (streak started in that title game) and the Wildcats 0-5 SU and ATS off a SU win versus the ACC, it would appear a win tonight would even seem more improbable. However, our database reminds us that defending champs are a not-so-sweet 1-4 SU and 0-5 ATS in this round since 2002. It also points out that the 'Cats are a rock-solid long term proposition as a dog (74-43-1 ATS since 1995), including 11-3 ATS off a SU dog win and 9-4 ATS in this tourney. In addition, Zona has yet to lose a game outside the conference this season against an opponent with at least one loss, standing **11-0 SU**. Terrific numbers, indeed, but the clincher is Arizona's 8-3 ATS mark in this event versus No. 1 seeds, including **5-1 SU and a perfect 6-0 ATS** when the 'Cats are not off a double-digit ATS win. With the pressure squarely on the Dukies, look for Coach K to build on his 900 career victories... next season. We're raising Arizona into 'Elite' status.

If our call on the UConn/San Diego State game is correct, then Marquette is the Big East's unlikely last team standing. And it won't be for long. While the conference's 6-1 ATS log as a dog in this round is one saving grace, it's hardly 'INCREDIBLE' enough for our liking. Not according to our INCREDIBLE STAT on page 2, as Carolina HC Roy Williams is a no-nonsense 25-0 SU and 16-8-1 ATS in this event versus sub .700 opposition, including 6-0 ATS as a favorite of less than nine points. And to make matters worse for Big East commissioner John Marinetto, Williams is a perfect 3-0 SU and ATS versus Marquette with every win coming by 24 or more points. His Heels are also 12-1 SU in their last 13 games versus his conference and 6-0 SU and 5-1 ATS their last six games in this round. As if that's not enough, the Golden Eagles are 0-3 SU and ATS off a SU dog win versus the ACC while No. 5 or lower Big East seeds are an overmatched 3-19 SU and 6-14-2 ATS from the Sweet 16 out. With Kendall Marshall running the point (16-2 SU since he took over) and the Tar Heels controlling the boards (+6.7 rebounding margin), nothing could be finer than to be backing Carolina this evening in Newark. The Elite 8 Dance card is full and it doesn't include the Big East Eleven. UNC clicks its Heels in double-step fashion tonight.

(1) Ohio St over (4) Kentucky by 11

Not only do the Buckeyes look dominant on the court but they appear rather 'AWESOME' on page two as well. Don't get us wrong, as one of only four Sweet 16 returnees, John Calipari's Bluegrass Cats can run with the best of them. However, our database points out that these returnees are an underwhelming **4-15 SU and 4-14-1 ATS** when facing .860 or greater opposition in this round. In addition, the 'Cats haven't exactly run 'Wild' outside of Lexington, posting a 3-7 ATS mark off a SU and ATS win. That's not a formula for success against an Ohio State squad that is ranked No. 2 in the nation in Offensive Field Goal Percentage (49.9) and is 5-1 ATS in its last six contests versus the SEC. One shining light is Calipari's 6-2 SU and ATS in Sweet 16 battles but Buckeyes supporters can turn to head coach Thad Matta's impressive 40-15-1 ATS record as a single-digit favorite off a SU and ATS win,

including **25-6-1 ATS** versus a foe off back-to-back SU wins. They can also relish the fact that Sweet 16 chalk off a win of 30 or more points are 6-1 ATS as favorites of seven or less points. Simply put, there's just way too much firepower on the Ohio State sidelines for these young Kentucky kittens. Lay it and play it.

With the No. 2-9 seeds long gone in this region, this shouldn't be much more than a Jay-walk through the Southwest for top-seeded Kansas. After all, the Jayhawks are the top shooting team in the land (51.4), No. 5 in the nation in rebounding margin (+8.6) and are a perfect 6-0 SU and ATS versus the Atlantic 10 elite (those with a greater than .750 win/loss percentage). Even our trusting PLAYBOOK.com database suggests that these high-profile teams advance as double-digit chalk in this round (21-2 SU). However, the ATS story may have quite a different ending. That juicy 21-2 SU number carries a bland 10-11-2 ATS mark, including 2-5 ATS when facing a foe off a SU dog win. We should also mention that Kansas is just 3-11 in this round since 1994 and 3-9 ATS as favorites of five or more points from the Sweet 16 out. And while we'd love to meander with the Spiders tonight in San Antonio, the fact of the matter is NCAA dogs of four or more points off four straight ATS wins are just 9-27-1 ATS. On the flip side, though, teams on a 3-0 SU and ATS run that won their conference title and enter off a win of 14 or more points are 10-2 SU and ATS in this round. We may have more on this one later in the week but our advice for now is to stop on red. Remember, 'Jaywalking' can be a punishable offense.

(10) Florida St over (11) Vcu by 7

Like Butler, it's hard to envision the Rams moving on since teams in this round are just 3-23 SU off back-to-back SU dog wins, including 1-5 ATS when not taking five or more points. However, with wins over the Pac-10, Big East and Big Ten, the Rams have proven tourney tough and would love nothing more than to add the ACC to its Dance card. But despite its vast 16.3 PPG scoring margin differential in this tourney – and with a 5-1 ATS mark in its last six showdowns with the ACC – we just don't feel that VCU can out-tough the No. 1 Defensive Field Goal Percentage team in the land (36.0). And, thanks to the return of Chris Singleton, one that has allowed a total of 107 points in its first two games (including 57 to high-scoring Notre Dame). How much does Singleton, the Seminoles' leading scorer and rebounder, mean to his team, you ask? Considering that Florida State was just 2-6 SU and 2-5-1 ATS this season against fellow tourney teams and now are 2-0 SU and ATS in this event with Singleton back in the lineup, we'll let you fill in the 'blanks' (along with VCU). And though the ACC's 0-4 ATS log as favorites of less than eight points in this round is a concern, the Rams' huge disadvantage on the glass (-8.9 rebounding differential between the two) is a much bigger one. Expect VCU to play more to the level of the team that owned an average win margin of only 4.1 PPG prior to the start of this event here tonight. With this game tipping off at 9:55 PM, the clock literally strikes midnight for the Cinderella Rams when this one is said and done. Like their in-state rival Gators, Seminoles win by a touchdown.
